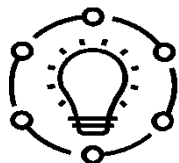

At Asterdale our vision
For RE is:



We believe it is important for our children to learn about and from different faiths and religions so they can understand and interact with the world around them.

We want our children to have and develop knowledge and understanding of Christianity and other principal religions represented in the UK and to appreciate the way their beliefs impact their life and behaviour.

We want our children to be able to make informed and reasoned judgements about religious and moral issues and enhance their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

Implementation

RE is taught using units from Twinkl. Through this the children will focus on Christianity, Judaism, Hinduism, Sikhism, Buddhism and Islam.

Consideration will also be given to non-religious communities such as Humanists.

Learning in RE will include listening and responding to stories, handling artefacts, drama, role play, music, dance, visits to places of worship where possible, taking part in whole school events, reflection opportunities, visits from local religious groups.

We have strong links to our local parish church and the children visit the church at least twice each year and also one of the priests visits school to lead assemblies every month.
